Overview:

SendMeGP is a 1-2 year discipleship program where young adults have the unique opportunity to build a foundation with Christ while still having the flexibility to attend a local community college or work at a job to help support their financial needs. This discipleship program has a wonderful design created where all kinds of people can receive all kinds of perks. To explain, if there is a young adult that is wanting to attend 1 day a week to help institute a daily routine to dive into the Bible and develop a relationship with Christ outside of the weekly Sunday services, there is a path for them. If a student wants to be involved 2 days a week, and not only develop that relationship with Christ but also learn what it means to serve a church by being involved in outreach opportunities, missions trips, and weekly discipleship opportunities from pastors, then they have a path as well.

If there are any students who plan on going into full time ministry, we have a path that will allow them to complete their ministers license through an Assemblies of God accredited university within this 2 year program. This 3 day program will allow for these full time interns to also receive pay for their help in the ministries they will have direct impact with. The overall goal of this program is to build up disciples who will become lead pastors, worship leaders, lay leaders, church communication directors, children ministries pastors, church secretaries, missionaries, and anything else that the Lord is calling these young adults to do.

Types of programs:

Foundational Program (1 Year/2 Years):

1 day a week (Tue)

- -Build a foundation with Christ by studying the Bible through completing Bible College classes
- -Learn how to serve a church.
- -Receive monthly touch ins with a Pastor for mentorship

Flex Program (2 Years):

2 days a week (Tue & Thur)

- -Build a foundation with Christ by studying the Bible through completing Bible College classes
- -Learn how to serve a church.
- -Receive monthly touch-ins with a Pastor for mentorship
- -Be on a strict schedule to become a certified minister through the Assemblies of God

Full-time Program (2 Years):

- 3 days a week (Tue-Thur)
- -Build a foundation with Christ by studying the Bible through completing Bible College classes
- -Learn how to serve a church.
- -Receive monthly touch-ins with a Pastor for mentorship
- -Be on a strict schedule to become a licensed minister through the Assemblies of God
- -Receiving hands on mentorship in ministry development at an assemblies of God church
- -Have the capability of stepping into a pastoral role after successfully completing this program
- -Receive pay based on performance in respective ministry track, hours fulfilled, and additional tasks given

Sunday's/Wednesday's (sit 2 serve 2):

- -Attend Sunday services as a member of the body. Take notes, listen to the message intently, enter into worship fervently and listen to the voice of God when he speaks so that you can be fed spiritually.
- -Attend Sunday services as a servant over your ministry tracks. Help support the leads over your respective tracks by helping the church the way Jesus helped; by teaching, by feeding, by serving, and by healing (Luke 22:27)
- -Attend regularly scheduled leadership meetings, outreaches, prayer events, and church wide events.

Trips scheduled:

Foundational Program, Flex Program and Full Time Program (1 Year/2 Years):

- -In all three programs, our interns will have the opportunity to take at least 1 trip to a conference. The reason for this, is for our Interns to be fed spiritually from not only our pastoral staff here but to hear some well known speakers and worship leaders who will help give a new fresh wind of The Holy Spirit that we can use in our town of Grants Pass.
- -In all three programs, our interns will have the opportunity to take at least 2 trips serving in some outreach for our home church and some smaller churches with needs.
- -In all three programs, our interns will have the opportunity to take an intern retreat to receive some great time in fellowship and community as we disciple them into young men and women of God.
- *Mission trips are also a possibility based on intern engagement, desire, and extra finances raised.

Bible College Credentials:

- -The goal for our Foundational program is to have every student develop a routine to dive into their Word and further establish a consistent prayer and study life which in turn will create a steady relationship with the Lord.
- -The goal for our Flex program is to have every student be certified under the assemblies of God to be a minister of the gospel.
- -The goal of our Full Time program is to have every student have the ability to apply to become a licensed minister under the assemblies of God.

Level One (Certified)

Upon completion of the Level One Ministerial Certificate, a student should possess the academic requirements to apply for Certified Minister status with the US General Council of the Assemblies of God. This would include a working knowledge of Bible study methods, New Testament content, and Pentecostal doctrine. He or she should possess the basic skills needed to begin serving in a ministerial role in the local church.

This would include a mastery of specified Bible content, systematic theology, and ministry skills.

Level Three (Ordained)

Upon completion of the Level Three Ministerial Certificate, a student should possess the academic requirements to apply for Ordained Minister status with the US General Council of the Assemblies of God. This would include mastery of several of the more difficult books of the Bible, advanced theological concepts, and administrative skills required for ministerial roles.

Cost for Internship:

Foundational Program (1 Year/2 Years):

- -In the Foundational program the cost will be 1,000 dollars. This will cover costs for our 4 guaranteed outreach's, conference, and retreat for one full year of the internship. Bible College will be an additional 500\$ that will be paid per class over the course of the year.
- -In the Flex program the cost will be 1,250 dollars. This will cover costs for our 4 guaranteed outreach's, conference, and retreat for one full year of the internship. Food on Thursday's will also be covered with this price. Bible College will be an additional 1,000\$ that will be paid per class over the course of the year.
- -In the Full-Time program the cost will be 1,500 dollars. This will cover costs for our 4 guaranteed outreach's, conference, and retreat for one full year of the internship. Food on Thursday's and personal mentorship with a leader every Wednesday will also be covered with this price. Bible College will be an additional 1,000\$ that will be paid per class over the course of the year.

^{*}Any missions trips, extra conferences, outreaches, or travel will be an additional cost that will be paid as we pursue new opportunities. Fundraisers and sponsorships will be available.
