



## To Our Parkway Family,

In reflecting on the Legacy Project (information enclosed), I was reminded by the Holy Spirit how important vision is for a church, individuals, and families. I am thankful that the generation before me invested in vision; now it's our turn to run after the one. Psalm 154:4 (MSG) states, "Generation after generation stands in awe of your work; each one tells the stories of your mighty acts." **A new story is about to be written**. In the end, the stories will have names of people directly impacted by a church's willingness to not settle on the stories of yesterday when the time comes for a new chapter to be written.

We know that without vision, people perish. Proverbs 29:18 (ESV) declares that without prophetic vision, the people are discouraged. Vision encourages the Church. If you study the word encourage, one definition can mean "to put the courage back in." The Church, in my opinion, has been on defense for far too long. Vision, by its nature, fulfills the promise that God gave Peter (Matthew 16:18) that the enemy could not defeat the advancing Church. Tozer spoke in a sermon entitled "The Dangers of Shallow Faith" the following: "I would estimate that no denomination has ever survived its 100th anniversary without the drastic overhaul from the inside out." These words are a warning as we approach our 100th anniversary in 2027. We need a fresh touch from the Holy Spirit. No building makeover, man-made idea, or trendy church trick will advance this Church. This Church will only grow if we are fueled by the power of the Holy Spirit and go on the offense again. The goal of this Legacy project is to tell this valley and more importantly, us that the Holy Spirit is still fueling His Church to reach the lost at any cost.
